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#### Understanding and preserving fibre quality through the cotton production pipeline



Cotton, a globally traded commodity, faces intensified competition from synthetic fibres, necessitating improvements in its production pipeline. Quality yarn production at a reasonable cost hinges on a thorough grasp of fibre properties, made feasible by the precise measurement techniques for cotton fibre quality parameters, exemplified by high-volume automatic testing systems.

Properties such as colour, trash, extraneous matter, micronaire, length, length uniformity, and strength significantly impact the cotton-textile value chain in different ways. For example, fibre colour minimally affects yarn processing performance unless it is an indication of microbial decay that compromises fibre length and strength. Fibre colour is nonetheless crucial for textile mills as it directly affects dyeing and finishing results.

# ITMF's Textile Machinery Workshop was held in Frankfurt alongside Techtextil / Texprocess



The ITMF / VDMA Textile Machinery Workshop & Dinner 2024 convened on April 22<sup>nd</sup> in Frankfurt, Germany, gathering industry experts worldwide.

Mr. Janpeter Horn, Chairman VDMA Textile Machinery, and Mr. K. V. Srinivasan, ITMF president, welcomed around 90 delegates to this unique event. Mr. Harald Weber, managing director of VDMA, shared insights into the global economic situation, discussing regional variations in industrial production and business climate, along with projections for 2024 and 2025. Mr. Yingxin Xu, vice president of CNTAC, provided insights into China's textile and apparel industry, covering market performance, modernization efforts, and future outlook. Representatives from Bangladesh, Europe, India,

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Indonesia, Korea, Vietnam, and Türkiye also shared market insights and challenges. Mr. Weber then introduced a session on textile machinery manufacturing including updates from Rieter, Oerlikon, Picanol, Brückner, and SPGPrints on the spinning, texturing, weaving, finishing, and printing segments. Discussions explored topics such as regulation, reuse/resale, recycling, as well as labour shortages in Europe.

Mr. Christian Schindler then presented the preliminary results of the 46th annual International Textile Machinery Shipment Statistics (ITMSS) compiled with more than 200 textile machinery manufacturers. Global shipments of new shot-staple and long-staple spindles saw a +2% and a +5% year-on-year increase, respectively. Deliveries of

open-end rotors and draw-texturing spindles declined by -17% and -28%, respectively. Shuttle-less looms experienced a significant uptick, rising by +52%. Large circular knitting machines saw a +17% growth while flat knitting machines surged by +61%. Overall, deliveries in the finishing segment saw a slight increase, averaging +1.5%. The session ended with a survey on the current state and outlook of the textile industry (download here).

The event encapsulated the complexity and diversity of the global textile machinery market, emphasizing both challenges and opportunities ahead.

The 46<sup>th</sup> annual International Textile Machinery Shipment Statistics will be published in May 2024.

# Cotton Inc. presents the latest price movements in the cotton textile supply chain

Mr. Jon Devine, <u>Cotton Incorporated</u>, studies price movements in the cotton supply chain every month. Here is his last analysis from retail to fiber:

**Retail** (latest data point for March): As measured by the CPI for garments, retail apparel prices increased month-over-month in March (+0.7%). Year-over-year, retail apparel prices were +0.2% higher. Relative to the 12-month average value before COVID (116.3 Mar 2019 to Feb 2020), the figure for March (122.3) is +4.9% higher.

Cotton-Dominant Apparel Import Prices (latest data point for February): The average price per square-meter equivalent of cotton-dominant apparel imports decreased in the latest seasonally adjusted data for February (from \$3.73/SME in January to \$3.64/SME). Compared to the 12-month average before COVID (Mar 2019 through Feb 2020 average was \$3.44/SME), the latest cost per cotton-dominant SME (\$3.64) is +5.8% higher.

**Yarn (latest data point for March):** Cotlook's yarn index increased +1.8% month-over-month in March. Year-over-year, the yarn index was -5.8% lower. Relative to the value before COVID (118.35 in Feb 2020), the latest monthly average for Cotlook's yarn index (140.65 in March 2024) is +18.8% higher.

**Fiber (latest data point for March):** The A Index increased marginally (+0.1%) month-over-month in March (from 99.61 in February to 99.7 cents/lb). Year-over-year, the A Index was essentially unchanged (95.39 cents/lb in March 2023). Relative to the value before COVID (76.6 cents/lb in Feb 2020), the latest monthly average for the A Index (99.74 cents/lb in March 2024) is +30.3% higher.
