US tariff turbulence keeps supply chains on edge

A widening macro-economic shock

The International Monetary Fund has trimmed its 2025 global-growth forecast to 2.8 %, 0.5 percentage points lower than its pre-tariff baseline. The OECD echoes this assessment, warning that the U.S. tariff wave "acts as a drag, particularly on business investment and trade" and will "feed through gradually to final goods prices. Tinancial markets are rattled: the IMF Global Financial Stability Report links April's tariff rounds to a spike in equity-market volatility and cautions that "authorities should prepare to deal with financial instability."

Trade flows are retrenching just as sharply. The WTO now expects world merchandise trade to contract by 0.2 % in 2025 instead of growing 2.7 %. Inside the United States, the Federal Reserve's Beige Book reports that most districts are already adding "tariff surcharges" and that "businesses expect to pass through additional costs to customers."

Why textiles and apparel feel the pain first

Textiles and apparel sit at the epicenter of the new tariff regime:

- Customs data analysed by FASH455 show that in February 2025 71.5 % of U.S. apparel imports still originated in Asia; the top five suppliers—China, Vietnam, Bangladesh, Cambodia and India accounted for 63.7 %, with China alone supplying 18.4 % by value. i Diversifying away from those origins is therefore neither quick nor cheap.
- Modelling by Yale University's Budget Lab finds that the 2025 tariff package lifts U.S. retail shoe prices 87% and apparel prices 65% in the short run; even after supply chains adjust, apparel remains 25% dearer and U.S. real-GDP growth is 1.1 percentage points lower.^{vii}
- In the same article, the Budget Lab shows the adverse effects of tariffs on commodity prices in the US and presents textile and apparel products at the top of the list (see Figure 1).

The Fed's Beige Book confirms that many firms intend to pass these cost increases on to consumers. In short, the tariff shock lands on a sector already grappling with tight margins, complex global value chains and highly pricesensitive demand.

A call for cooperative solutions

The message is unequivocal across multiple independent sources: unilateral tariffs are inflating prices, suppressing growth and magnifying uncertainty. For textiles and apparel, a rules-based trading system is not a luxury but a necessity.

ITMF therefore urges all governments to re-engage in constructive, rules-based negotiations before further damage is done to a sector that sustains millions of jobs—particularly in developing economies.

ITMF & ITA latest webinar on AI applications in the textile value chain available now

On 2 April 2025, the 5th webinar in ITMF's Series on "AI in the Textile Value Chain" pulled in a global audience keen to learn more about AI applications in the industry.

Belgium-based Maximilian Bock (**Eekual**) opened the program with a live demo of Eekual's cloud design engine that shrinks product-development lead times from weeks to minutes. Linking real-time body scans with generative design, the platform points to a world of "instant personal clothing" that virtually eliminates dead stock.

Next, Jonas Falkner and Friedrich Weninger (**MIR Insight**, Norway) unveiled a multimodal AI suite that blends macro-economic data, social-media sentiment and historical sales to forecast market risk factors.

Rounding up the line-up, Dr Jelle Demeulemeester (**MYND**, Belgium) placed the above use-cases in an academic context, mapping where machine-learning interventions align most closely with emerging research priorities—from fibre sourcing to post-consumer recycling.

Al is no longer a futuristic add-on; it is fast merging with operating systems in modern textile manufacturing.

ITMF's April 2nd press release on US-tariffs



In our April 2nd press release, ITMF warned that the sharp US tariff hikes on imported goods—raising tariffs on most textile and apparel imports from 11-12 percent to as high as 38-65 percent—will upend global textile and apparel supply chains and drive retail prices higher in the United States.

ITMF President K. V. Srinivasan noted that 95 percent of clothing sold in the U.S. is imported, mainly from China, Vietnam, India, Bangladesh, and Indonesia, and that shifting orders to lower-tariff countries or reshoring production is questionable because of higher costs, limited capacities, and shortages of skilled labor.

Tajikistan will host its first International Textile Forum and Machinery Exhibition on 8–10 July 2025. The event will convene suppliers, brands, manufacturers, and associations from around the world and offer targeted B2B/G2B meetings where current challenges in the global textile industry will be discussed.

The event aligns with Tajikistan's 2024-2030 plan to turn its 400,000 tons of annual cotton production into higher-value exports through 10 new integrated clusters. With incentives on offer and the government's support, the forum aims at providing a fast track to partnerships in a market committed to growth.
